
The Spring Gardens



City Harvest

The Spring Gardens helps address local food insecurity issues by participating in the PHS City Harvest program.

- Over 1,500 pounds of fresh, organic produce each growing season

- 300 Ministries kitchen and food preparation instruction

Environmental Stewardship

TSG is philosophically an organic garden that takes environmental stewardship seriously.

- 100% permeable garden produces no storm water runoff
- Water provided to gardeners in barrels to promote hand watering
- Large scale composting with plans to compost 100% of garden plant material
- Exploring use of cisterns to pair with future roofed structures
- Future plans include deploying solar panels
