ORDER DENYING PWD MOTION IN LIMINE: HAVER

On April 6, 2021, the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD or Department) filed

a Motion in Limine (Motion) addressed to the prepared direct testimony presented by Lance Haver

(Haver St. 1), a pro se participant in this proceeding. In this Motion, the Department asserted that

the legal argument and conclusions contained in the statement are not the proper subject of

testimony (but may be raised in briefs) and therefore those portions of Mr. Haver's testimony

should be excluded or stricken. Mr. Haver had stated that in his opinion the public hearings held

in this matter on March 16 and 18, 2021, were legally insufficient as the amount of any funds PWD

may receive from the recently enacted American Rescue Plan (and their impact on the revenue

increase request at issue here) were unknown at the time of the hearings.

The Department is correct; legal analysis and conclusions such as that presented by

Mr. Haver are not the appropriate subject of testimony whether or not he is an attorney but may be

raised in appropriate motions or briefs. On the other hand, there is no apparent harm to any of the

participants by denying the Motion and allowing the testimony. There is no jury to be confused;

both I and the Rate Board can determine the appropriate probative weight (if any) to be accorded

to any item of testimony or evidence.

This Motion in Limine will be DENIED.
