



HOW CITY COUNCIL'S DRIVER EQUALITY BILL AFFECTS PPD & YOU

REDUCES RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

The bill prohibits Philadelphia police from stopping vehicles for certain low-level driving code infractions.

PROMOTES TRANSPARENCY

City Council also passed a bill creating a searchable online database for traffic stops in the city, aimed at increasing policing transparency.

VIOLATIONS WILL BE MAILED

PPD will no longer stop drivers for minor traffic infractions, however, the violations will still be noted and sent to the driver's address.
