One Philly, A United City Citywide Clean-Up: Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the "One Philly, A United City" Citywide Clean-Up?

The Office of Clean and Green Initiatives, in collaboration with various city departments along with quasi-governmental agencies and nonprofits, will address the many systemic and incessant quality of life issues related to litter, illegal dumping, graffiti, abandoned automobiles, vacant lots, and nuisance properties. The goal of the program is to clean every neighborhood in the City of Philadelphia over a 13-week period throughout the summer starting June 3rd through August 26th, 2024. The Citywide Clean-Up is a first of its kind, place-based cleaning and quality of life improvement initiative to help deliver on Mayor Parker's vision of creating a safer, cleaner, and greener Philadelphia.

2. How will the Clean-Up work?

The One Philly, United Citywide Cleaning & Greening Program will operate on a 13-week schedule from the week of June 3rd through the week of August 26th. The plan utilizes the Sanitation Department's pre-established collection routes to clean neighborhoods within a certain Sanitation District each week (*see map*). The Sanitation Department's new district-based residential cleaning teams will work, in tandem, with a goal of cleaning all blocks in each district in a given week. Sanitation Department SWEEP officers will also patrol areas following cleanings to identify and ticket violators of public ordinances meant to reduce trash and litter conditions.

Meanwhile, partnering agencies will deploy their own crews to clean on the same schedule in each district, e.g. Philadelphia Parks and Recreation will clean certain neighborhood parks and rec centers, the School District will clean certain schools, the Commerce Department's Taking Care of Business program will clean commercial corridors, the Philadelphia Water Department will clean Green Stormwater Infrastructure and inlet locations, and SEPTA will clean certain transit stations.

In addition to the cleaning of streets and facilities, persistent quality of life issues will be addressed on the same schedule on a district-by-district basis. The Streets Department will pave potholes, L+I will address vacant properties and nuisance businesses, the Philadelphia Police Department and Philadelphia Parking Authority will tow abandoned vehicles, and the Community Life Improvement Program will remediate vacant lots and remove graffiti to more comprehensively and proactively address quality of life issues all at once in the same area.

3. Who is involved in the citywide clean up?

Partnering City departments and other governmental agencies include:

Other, non-profit organizations involved in the Clean-Up include the PHL Taking Care of Business commercial corridor cleaning partners (including dozens of neighborhood CDCs and RCOs), Mural Arts, and the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society.

4. How will you track and collect data?

City staff will capture the work performed during the Clean-Up by using a smartphone application called Quick Capture that will provide an easy-to-use way for participating departments and crews to log the work they complete. App users will be responsible for taking photos of the work performed and sending the data through the app, which will then be mapped back to a centralized geo-spatial database managed by the Office of Clean and Green Initiatives (OCG), the data will be summarized in the map shown below on www.officeofcleanandgreen.org on the "Join the Fight" page. Departmental crews will also be expected to identify and close existing 311 requests in each district and create and close new 311 requests so that all data is ultimately fed into the City's 311 system.



5. What are some of the key goals and results you anticipate achieving?

Some of the key results and goals we expect to achieve include:

- Cleaning every neighborhood in the city. This includes ~18,000 blocks encompassing 1,823 miles.
- 129 Commercial corridors cleaned by 39 commercial corridor cleaning partners employing 300+ Cleaning Ambassadors
- Clean between 10-20 Schools in each district
- Clean approximately 40 Parks and Rec centers citywide, address outstanding work orders, and perform tree maintenance.
- Conduct outreach to all businesses in advance of L+I Quality of Life Inspections and issuance of violations.
- Conduct inspections and perform "clean and seals" of abandoned properties.
- Remove instances of graffiti

- Fill potholes in each district
- Investigate 311 complaints, issue warnings, and tow abandoned vehicles.
- Perform surface maintenance at 40 Green Stormwater Infrastructure sites and 840+ PWD inlet locations.
- Clean, abate, and maintain millions of square feet of vacant land through the City's Community Life Improvement Program and the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society's LandCare program.
- Green 330,000 new square feet of vacant land by adding soil, grass and fencing to blighted lots.
- Clean, pressure wash, and sanitize 30+ SEPTA transit hubs and stations, focusing on entrances, exits, and platforms.

6. How will you communicate results with the public?

Data of work performed will be summarized in a map highlighted on the "Join the Fight" page at www.officeofcleanandgreen.org.



7. How can the public get involved?

Visit <u>www.officeofcleanandgreen.org</u> to get involved, stay informed, and take advantage of various resources - for example, to become a block captain, organize a community clean-up, get a recycling bin, plant a tree, etc.

The website will also have an interactive map where the public can monitor the cleaning schedule and explore cleaning efforts by neighborhood.

We also encourage members of the public to submit 311 requests to help us identify issues and hot spots in your neighborhood.

The Office of Clean and Green Initiatives and the Sanitation Department are also working closely with the Philadelphia More Beautiful Committee to encourage block captains and residents to clean on the days City staff will be in their neighborhood.


The One Philly, A United City Citywide Program is a partnership between the city and the residents of Philadelphia.

The City will provide resources to:

• Address quality of life issues related to litter, illegal dumping, graffiti, abandoned automobiles, vacant lots, and nuisance properties.

Residents are urged:

- Place trash and recycling collections out on designated day at authorized location between 7p.m. the day before and 7a.m. on trash day.
- Place trash and recycling collections out in proper containers / bags to prevent spillage.
- Only set household trash for pick up. Sweep sidewalks and gather debris. Do not sweep into the street.
