

OVERVIEW: This nomination proposes to designate the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant and list it on the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places. The proposed district includes 572 properties in West Philadelphia that are primarily residential and commercial buildings. This district is the first of four anticipated in Spruce Hill, encompassing an area that will eventually include approximately 2,000 properties. For administrative purposes, the area was divided east to west at 43rd Street, and north to south at Spruce Street, into four quadrants and each of the four quadrants is being nominated separately and sequentially, owing to the complexities of nominating large numbers of properties simultaneously. It is anticipated that nominations for the other three quadrants will follow as the inventories are completed. The boundaries of the district currently proposed are generally 43rd Street to the west; Spruce Street to the north; 39th Street to the east; and Baltimore and Woodland Avenues to the south.

The nomination states that the proposed district satisfies Criteria for Designation A, C, D, E, and J. Under Criterion A, the nomination argues that Spruce Hill has significant character, interest, and value as part of the development of West Philadelphia where public transportation drove speculative development of a high caliber that still retains its architectural integrity. Under Criteria C and D, the nomination states that Spruce Hill reflects the environment in an era characterized by distinctive architectural styles and that the buildings embody distinguishing characteristics of mid to late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century architectural styles, including Italianate, Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Neo-Grec, Second Empire, and Georgian Revival. Under Criterion E, the nomination outlines the significant architects commissioned to design buildings in Spruce Hill, including Samuel Sloan, Theophilus P. Chandler, G.W. and W.D. Hewitt, and Willis G. Hale. Lastly, under Criterion J, the nomination argues that Spruce Hill exemplifies the cultural, political, economic, social, or historical heritage of the community, as an exemplary representation of West Philadelphia's development as a streetcar suburb.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: The staff recommends that the nomination demonstrates the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant satisfies Criteria for Designation A, C, D, E, and J.

RECUSAL:

• Ms. Barucco recused from the review of the nomination, owing to her involvement in preparing the nomination.

PRESENTERS:

- Ms. Chantry presented the nomination to the Committee on Historic Designation.
- Attorney David Orphanides, preservation consultant Sharon Fleming, and Janine Sanzari of the Spruce Hill Community Association represented the nomination.
- Numerous property owners participated in the discussion.

DISCUSSION:

- Mr. Laverty stated that he would need to leave the meeting at 1:30 p.m. which would result in the loss of a quorum at that time.
 - The Committee proceeded with the review, acknowledging that Mr. Laverty's departure in approximately 50 minutes would mean that the review of the nomination would continue at a future Committee meeting.
- Mr. Orphanides, Ms. Fleming, and Ms. Sanzari summarized the significance of the proposed historic district.
- Numerous property owners participated in the discussion.
 - Matt Myers, the owner of 329 S. 43rd Street, commented in support of the nomination.
 - Samantka Monroe, representing 4208 and 4210 Chester Avenue, commented in opposition to the nomination. She stated that her properties are already designated as part of the 4208-30 Chester Avenue Historic District. She questioned why 4200, 4202, 4204, and 4206 Chester Avenue, which were excluded from the 4208-30 Chester Avenue Historic District, are now included in the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant. It was noted that a petition in opposition for the inclusion of 4204 Chester Avenue was provided to the Committee. She asked that the matter be tabled until a proper community meeting with property owners is held.
 - Jane Chi, the owner of 507 S. 41st Street, commented in opposition to the nomination.
 - Attorney Michael Phillips, representing Campus Apartments and University City Housing, which collectively own 50 properties within the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, commented in opposition to the nomination. He referenced his letter submitted in advance of the meeting which outlined the reasons for opposition. He explained that the opposition is based on procedural grounds, stating that the nomination for a quadrant is "incomplete and unripe" and should be returned to the Historical Commission's staff. He stated that he could not opine on the merits of the nomination because the nomination is incomplete.
 - LiLing Choing, the business owner of Five Star Deli at 4204 Chester Avenue, commented in opposition to the nomination. She expressed frustration at her property having been excluded from the 4208-30 Chester Avenue Historic District in 2022, only to now be included in the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant.

- Vimukti Aslan, the owner of a unit in 4202 Pine Street, commented in support of the nomination.
- Della Langan, the owner of 4245 Regent Square, commented in opposition to the nomination. She expressed concern about an increased cost to do work, and about work happening in the neighborhood without permits.
- Joan Weiner, the owner 4217 Pine Street, commented in support of the nomination.
- Attorney Oleg Sokolov, representing the owners of eight properties, 3955 Baltimore Avenue, 3924 Pine Street, 415 S. 40th Street, 3931 Baltimore Avenue, 4003 Baltimore Avenue, 4007 Baltimore Avenue, 4009 Baltimore Avenue, and 4015 Baltimore Avenue, commented in opposition to the nomination. He stated that the nomination is incomplete as proposed.
- Mathew Grubel, the owner of 4233 Regent Square, commented in support of the nomination.
- Adam Goldman, the owner of 4102 Spruce Street and 426 S. 42nd Street, commented in support of the nomination. He lamented the loss through demolition of historic buildings in Spruce Hill in recent years.
- Mr. Farnham stated that the Committee was about to lose its quorum. He
 recommended that the Committee acknowledge that fact, conclude the meeting, and
 recommend to the Historical Commission at its 10 May 2024 meeting to direct this
 matter back to the Committee for the continuation of the review at a future meeting.
 He explained that everyone, including property owners who had not yet spoken and
 the public, would have an opportunity to participate in the review at that future
 Committee meeting.
- Ms. Cooperman stated that the Committee would proceed as Mr. Farnham has recommended, with the expectation that the matter will be taken up again at a Committee meeting in the near future.
- Mr. Orphanides requested that, owing to the amount of time that participants for this
 matter had to wait for today's review and will continue to have to wait for it to be
 heard again, it be placed first on an upcoming Committee on Historic Designation
 agenda.
 - Ms. Cooperman responded that she does not control the order of the agenda, but that this is a reasonable request.

COMMITTEE ON HISTORIC DESIGNATION FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS:

The Committee on Historic Designation found that:

- It should not proceed with the review after losing quorum.
- The Historical Commission can direct the matter back to the Committee for the continuation of the review at a future meeting.

COMMITTEE ON HISTORIC DESIGNATION RECOMMENDATION: The Committee on Historic Designation voted to recommend that the Historical Commission remand the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant nomination to the Committee on Historic Designation for the continuation of the review at a future meeting.

§14-1004. Designation.

(1) Criteria for Designation.

A building, complex of buildings, structure, site, object, or district may be designated for preservation if it:

- (a) Has significant character, interest, or value as part of the development, heritage, or cultural characteristics of the City, Commonwealth, or nation or is associated with the life of a person significant in the past;
- (b) Is associated with an event of importance to the history of the City, Commonwealth or Nation:
- (c) Reflects the environment in an era characterized by a distinctive architectural style;
- (d) Embodies distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style or engineering specimen:
- (e) Is the work of a designer, architect, landscape architect or designer, or professional engineer whose work has significantly influenced the historical, architectural, economic, social, or cultural development of the City, Commonwealth, or nation;
- (f) Contains elements of design, detail, materials, or craftsmanship that represent a significant innovation;
- (g) Is part of or related to a square, park, or other distinctive area that should be preserved according to a historic, cultural, or architectural motif;

- (h) Owing to its unique location or singular physical characteristic, represents an established and familiar visual feature of the neighborhood, community, or City;
- (i) Has yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in pre-history or history; or
- (j) Exemplifies the cultural, political, economic, social, or historical heritage of the community.




Figure 2. The Spruce Hill Historic District quadrants. The subject of this nomination is the southeast quadrant (green). Others are, northeast (red), northwest (yellow) and southwest (blue). Note that the northeast, northwest and southwest quadrant boundaries are subject to change.




Figure 3. The Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, outlined in green above. The boundaries of the Southeast Quadrant are, generally, 43rd Street to the west, Spruce Street to the north, 39th Street to the east; and Baltimore and Woodland avenues to the south.

4. DESCRIPTION

Introduction

The Spruce Hill Historic District is a primarily residential district in West Philadelphia (Figure 1). For administrative purposes the district has been divided east to west at 43rd Street, and north to south at Spruce Street, into four quadrants (Figure 2). These divisions are intended solely to ease the burden on the Philadelphia Historical Commission staff of reviewing nearly 2,000 properties in a single nomination. While this nomination describes the whole of the Spruce Hill Historic District, only the Southeast Quadrant is currently proposed for listing. Nominations for the other three quadrants will follow as the inventories are completed. The boundaries of the Southeast Quadrant are, generally, 43rd Street to the west, Spruce Street to the north, 39th Street to the east; and Baltimore and Woodland avenues to the south (Figure 3).

The significance of the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District was recognized in 1997 when the West Philadelphia Streetcar Suburb Historic District, which encompasses the proposed district boundaries, was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1997. Also, there have been two prior efforts to nominate the Spruce Hill Historic District to the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places.¹ It should be noted that this nomination borrows heavily, and at times directly, from these preceding works.

The Spruce Hill Historic District

The Spruce Hill Historic District was largely shaped during the heyday of the omnibuses and horse-car street railroads that transformed the scale of the City of Philadelphia after 1854. The district is a mix of single, twin and detached houses interspersed with churches and other institutional buildings that served, and continue to serve, the local community. Commercial storefronts are sprinkled among houses in scattered strips along trolley routes. Red brick sidewalks and an abundance of street trees, acting in visual concert with the low stone walls and iron fences that enclose small front yards in front of a preponderance of residences from all periods, contribute to the character of the district and are considered contributing elements (Figure 4).

The district generally conforms to the pattern of the westward evolution of the city. Most pre-Civil War era housing is found east of 42nd Street, in the Southeast Quadrant, while late nineteenth and early twentieth century housing extends west to 45th and 46th Streets where it merges with the automobile suburb of Garden Court. It is

roughly bordered by the University of Pennsylvania on the east; by the Woodlands Cemetery, the Saint Joseph's University, University City Campus, and the west edge of Clark Park on the south; and by the Garden Court National Register Historic District on the west. The northern edge is the most irregular, picking up modest rowhouses that survive along Ludlow and Chestnut Streets at the west end, and a combination of rowhouses and commercial development along Chestnut Street to the east. Despite a general conversion from single family, elite and middle class housing to apartments

serving students of the academic institutions that are along the east and south edges, the district buildings survive with a high degree of integrity, making it possible to understand the evolutionary patterns and history of the district.




Figure 5. 1753 Scull and Heap map showing Darby Road (red arrow) and the former High Street, now Market Street (blue arrow). Nicholas Scull and George Heap, *A Map of Philadelphia and Parts Adjacent*, August 1753.




Figure 6. 1819 map showing the former Darby Road (red arrow) now extended past the Hamilton Seat to the northeast and renamed the Baltimore Post & Stage Road. Note that the Market Street (blue arrow) ferry of 1753 has been replaced by the Permanent Bridge across the Schuylkill River. John Melish, *Map of Philadelphia County*, (Philadelphia: Tanner, Vallance, Kearny & Co., 1819).

The Spruce Hill district is formed on an armature of ancient highways and newer local streets that served the area first known as Blockley Township and later as the Township of West Philadelphia. These highways connected to the western agricultural regions that surrounded William Penn's City of Philadelphia across the Schuylkill River. Of these, the earliest was the Darby Road (portions of which are now Woodland and Baltimore avenues) which marked a southwestern route from Philadelphia to Darby and then on to Wilmington, DE. At the northern district boundary is the other important east-west corridor, the extension of the city's High (now Market) Street across the Permanent Bridge over the Schuylkill River which, west beyond the city limits, becomes West Chester Pike (Figures 5 and 6). Like the Darby Road, High Street formed an important part of the regional transportation network and became a focus for streetcar lines and later for commercial and industrial activities that provided employment.

Before it was infilled and culverted over, Mill

Creek formed the western limit of the larger district's Southeast Quadrant. The 1872 Hopkins *Atlas of West Philadelphia* shows that the middle portion of the creek, including the mill dam, between Market Street and Baltimore Avenue, had been culverted over by that time, while portions above and below the Mayland Mill Dam remained open.² The same atlas plate shows a pond along the west side of the Clarence H. Clark property at the corner of 42nd and Spruce streets (Figure 7). The depression on that site, now the location of the Philadelphia Divinity School and Penn Alexander School, remains, and with the culvert under 43rd Street and the bowl of Clark Park,

recalls the early history of the region as a center of water-powered manufacturing. While the waterway is no longer, the valley formed by the creek is the principal geographic feature of the Spruce Hill Historic District, and the Southeast Quadrant in particular.

The street grid of the neighborhood was separated from William Penn's city by the Schuylkill River, connected initially by the Permanent Bridge at Market Street, built in 1805 (see Figure 6). Additional bridges soon followed at Chestnut and Walnut Streets, and later at South Street, and would serve as conduits first for omnibuses, and after 1854 for the new technology of the rail-born horse-drawn streetcars.³ Ease of access between the city and West Philadelphia encouraged further development, with each new bridge crossing the Schuylkill River providing additional routes for travel and encouraging adjacent settlement. By the end of the Civil War, suburban houses were being built along horsecar routes that extended along Market and Chestnut Streets, with the Philadelphia City Horse Car Line ending at a car barn at 41st and Chestnut Streets, while the Market Street line ended at 41st Street and Haverford Avenue, north of Market Street. Routes that terminated in the trolley barn at 48th and Woodland Avenue were opened just before the Civil War and again became a focus of residential development.

Clusters of various housing types denote the eras of the district's development. Along the eastern district boundary near 40th Street, in areas that were closer to the city, groups of two and three story brick rowhouses are typical. This cluster of denser housing once extended as far east as 32nd Street, forming a link with the old city and largely serving the industries located along the railroad tracks on the west bank of the Schuylkill River. Most of this housing has been demolished through the expansion of the University of Pennsylvania, but a few blocks of small and medium-sized rows remain along the 3900 blocks of Baltimore, Pine and Delancey Streets in the Southeast Quadrant, and the 4000 blocks of Locust and Ludlow streets. There are additional

rows on Sansom Street west of 40th Street and in the 4400 blocks of Chestnut and Sansom Streets that represent Centennial era building styles and the greater density stimulated by direct proximity to trolley routes. These houses typically share a vocabulary of hard pressed brick, stone lintels and sills, and cornices of wood or pressed metal, depending on date.

Unlike the worker's rows of north and south Philadelphia, most of the row houses of West Philadelphia are the larger three-story variety with narrower rear ells bringing light into the building cores. Two-story houses that served the working classes are much rarer in this district, indicating the typical wealth of the community whose men commuted to center city instead of to industrial jobs in the immediate vicinity (Figures 8, 9 and 10). For example, two groups of plain brick, two-story houses can be found west of 41st on Ludlow Street below Market Street. Another cluster of tiny brick houses can be found on Irving Street east of 41st Street where a portion of the African-American community was built in the vicinity of a small African Methodist church that was demolished for the construction of the University of Pennsylvania Dental School at 40th and Locust streets, in 1915. That community was an offshoot of a larger African-American community to the north.

The remainder of the community was more homogeneous, with generally middle and upper middle class residents represented by the size and types of houses. West of 40th Street, in the Southeast Quadrant, single and "twin" houses on large lots with front lawns or gardens predominate and establish the suburban character of this zone. Many of these were architect-designed, usually for wealthy individual clients who could afford private architectural commissions, while others were parts of small real estate developments that built in variety to provide the honorific status of individuality. While some buildings have been badly altered, the 500 block of Woodland Terrace, the 200 block of South 42nd Street and the 4000 block of Pine Street are good examples of the complex balanced architectural compositions that characterize significant clusters of Civil War era housing (Figures 11 and 12). Most of these early houses are of brownstone or stucco over stone, and designed in Gothic and Italianate revival styles advocated by Andrew Jackson Downing in *The Architecture of Country Houses* (1851).

Many of these large suburban houses were located near the ends of the omnibus and trolley lines that targeted Woodlands Cemetery. Pre-Centennial development is found in the Southeast Quadrant, on the blocks between Baltimore and Woodland avenues on land divided off from the Woodlands estate at the time that the Woodlands Cemetery Company was formed in 1841.⁴ Several terraces of suburban houses in the immediate vicinity were designed by Samuel Sloan for Samuel A. Harrison and Nathaniel B. Browne.⁵ Three much-altered houses of the Hamilton Terrace group of 1854 still stand on 41st Street between Baltimore and Chester Avenues. They originally formed a symmetrical composition with cottages in the "Elizabethan" manner at the north and south ends (demolished), a pair of "Classic" or Italianate cottages next toward the center, and in the middle a "Norman Villa" characterized by its drop moldings above the windows. Nine years later Sloan designed a similar grouping on both sides of Woodland Terrace for Charles Leslie, alternating asymmetrical brownstone twins with stuccoed symmetrical twins.⁶ Other developers tried similar symmetrical schemes including one involving twin houses of Italianate design at the west end of the south side of the 4000 block of Pine Street (see Figure 12).⁷

The horsecar lines along Market and Chestnut streets became the locus of blocks of mid-century suburban houses along Chestnut and Walnut Streets, ending a block or two west of the trolley barn at 42nd and Chestnut streets. That plain brick trolley barn with a projecting brick cornice still exists, converted into a commercial printing plant but retaining its industrial character (Figure 13). Many of these Italianate houses have been adapted to apartments, fraternities, and commercial use, but their blocky massing and deep, bracketed wood cornices are evidence of their origins in the first wave of development around the

Civil War. These include houses on the 4000 and 4100 blocks of Walnut Street, the 100 block of S. 40th Street and the William Barker house at 4207 Walnut Street, now occupied by Walnut Hill College. Another important development of large houses that was constructed near the horsecar lines is the symmetrical composition of large houses on the east side of 42nd Street between Locust and Spruce Streets. These form a symmetrical composition of picturesque brownstone towered single houses framing symmetrical twin houses and were designed by architect John D. Jones in 1861. The towered stone house at the south end of the block was demolished and replaced by an apartment house, Spruce Hall, in the early 20th century.

A peculiar development type differentiates this region from other areas in the city, namely the hierarchically designed clusters of housing built as an entire scheme by individual developers. These place larger houses on the larger and more visible streets with smaller houses on small rear streets. The earliest project of this type in the area is the early 1870s row-house-like twins developed by Thomas Powers on the south side of the 4000 block of Chestnut Street. They were built in conjunction with much more modest mansarded row houses along the smaller Sansom Street to the south (Figures 14 and 15). A similar hierarchical development is found in the Govett development group on the north side of Pine Street east of 40th Street. There, large, three-story row houses with incised stone lintels and keystones were constructed on the north side of Pine Street; small mansarded row houses with pierced wood cornices were constructed along the south side of Delancey Street; and moderate sized mansarded brownstone twins faced 40th Street. Only the pair at 40th and Delancey Street remain; the southeast corner at 40th and Pine was replaced by an apartment building (currently "Pine Arms") c. 1925. This development, located in the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, was recognized in the Drexel-Govett Historic District, listed in the Philadelphia Register in 2022.

A more evolved hierarchical group is the important post-Centennial development between Walnut and Locust Streets west of 42nd Street on the site of the Sinnott house. There oversized Ruskinian Gothic twin houses with large panels of brownstone and marble framed by brick pilasters on the main fronts were constructed along Walnut Street; slightly smaller twins with shingled and cross-timbered gables face 42nd Street while St. Marks Square is lined on both sides with three-story brick rows with porch fronts and small gardens. Another of these developments was built by William Weightman a few years later, just east, and outside of, the district between Sansom and Walnut Streets west of 39th Street. There the large twins on Walnut Street have given way to commercial development but the oversized row houses with porch fronts on 39th Street and the smaller porch-fronted row houses on Sansom Street survive to indicate that this development scheme was common among those with sufficient capital to assemble a large property.

Proximity to omnibus and horsecar lines was not the only advantage for development. Because of their width and their connection to bridges, Chestnut and Walnut Streets were principal east-west routes to the city center, leading to construction of a group of large houses between the end of the Civil War and the early twentieth century. Within the district, most of these houses have been demolished except for publishing magnate William Swain's residence at 3925 Chestnut Street; the Tudor Gothic house by

George T. Pearson for publisher Wilmer Atkinson at 4106 Locust Street; and the brick mansion for financier Clarence Clark, Jr. across Spruce Street from the parental estate, at 42nd Street (Figures 16 and 17).⁸ The Swain house on the 3900 block of Chestnut Street is now the Ronald McDonald House. Designed in the 1890s by William Decker in imported limestone massed into the fashionable Richardsonian Romanesque style, it exemplifies the size and level of elaboration of the largest of these important mansions.

The adaptation of the Woodland Avenue route to trolleys

promoted additional development along Woodland, Baltimore and Springfield Avenues. When the lines along these streets were electrified in 1895 and extended south and west toward the city limits, this path to the city spurred a second round of development characterized by the yellow-tan and purplish-brown brick fronted twin houses of vaguely classical styling that represent turn of the century fashion. Cornices are often fabricated of pressed metal and porches are usually carried on wood columns, often with mass produced pressed gesso detail, resulting in a high level of detail that distinguishes these houses. Varnished doors with beveled glass, leaded glass transoms and bay windows are emblematic of the rising consumer culture of the period and the availability of these mass produced architectural elements through lumber yards and mail order catalogues.

These end-of-the-19th-century projects usually encompassed entire blocks, producing an architectural unity that was consciously avoided

in the earlier developments. Aimed at the men who worked in the booming industries of the era, they are typically three and even four stories in height with as many as six and eight bedrooms. These did not necessarily reflect large families and live-in servants but more often housed boarders who worked in the downtown and provided an additional source of income for families that were stretching their means to buy large houses (Figure 18). Beyond 46th Street, most of the early twentieth century houses make accommodations for the automobile with rear alleys and rear garages. East of 46th Street, garages, where they exist, are afterthoughts. The increased population attracted businesses along the trolley routes of Baltimore Avenue that became a zone of commercial activity for the community, particularly west of 45th

Street. East of 45th commercial establishments were primarily grouped at corner intersections where, in some cases, several of the Italianate houses of the first phase of suburbanization were adapted to shops in the early twentieth century.

Towering above the houses of the district are late 19th and early 20th century churches that form the principal landmarks of the community. Again, architectural style is telling in establishing date and generally conforms to the period of development of the community. Most churches occupy corner sites and are clustered together, suggesting regional sub-centers. One center is in the vicinity of 42nd Street in the Southeast Quadrant, which includes the former Trinity Episcopal Church of Maylandsville at the northeast corner of 42nd Street and Baltimore Avenue, now The City School (K-5). Constructed of local schist stone with brick and brownstone trim and gabled slate roofs, the former church is an interesting example of polychromatic Gothic Revival by Charles Burns (Figure 19). As is typical, the bell tower occupies the corner of the property, giving it the highest visibility and prominence. Nearby to the north at 42nd and Pine Street is a modest Gothic revival church of 1890 designed by Isaac Purcell that replaced an earlier chapel by Addison Hutton, which served the Woodland Presbyterian Church congregation (now Resurrection Philadelphia). Further west at 44th Street on the north edge of Clark Park, stands the stone chapel for the Home of the Merciful Saviour School for Crippled Children of the Episcopal Church designed by George T. Pearson.

A second cluster of churches was built at the northern edge of the district near the transit lines. The earliest within the district to survive is the former African Baptist Church of Blockley, just north of Chestnut Street at 41st and Ludlow streets. renamed Oak Street Baptist Church in 1853. The current church building was constructed by

1888 and the name changed to Monumental Baptist Church (Figure 20). It was sold to St. James Pentecostal Church in 1967.⁹ The projecting wood framing in the central gable and decorative brickwork (now painted over) of the building attest to its construction in the Centennial decade. Another neighborhood church is the English Gothic Tabernacle Baptist Church on the 4000 block of Chestnut Street designed by Frank Watson in 1895. Of dark gray granite with limestone trim, it follows the conventions of urban churches with the main façade facing the street front. At 4017 Walnut Street is the elegant Early Christian design of the former First Church of Christ Scientist, the work of New York architects Carrère and Hastings, built in 1908 and now occupied by Christ Community Church (Figure 21).¹⁰




Figure 22. Rendering by Ray Hollis of the proposed twenty building campus of the Philadelphia Divinity School (c. 1922). Only six buildings from the original plan were ever built. (University of Pennsylvania Almanac, https://almanac.upenn.edu/archive/volumes/v56/n27/divinity.html.)

Set apart from churches that were near the transit lines is the remarkable Gothic revival complex of the Philadelphia Divinity School. Founded in 1857 by the Bishop of Pennsylvania, Alonzo Potter, the school was one of the first Episcopalian seminaries to admit and train African American and women students. It is the seminary's third site in West Philadelphia (earlier sites included 39th and Walnut streets, and at the end of the 19th century, 47th and Kingsessing Avenue). This, the final and most important complex was begun in 1919 and was planned to occupy the entire block of the Clark Estate along Spruce Street between 42nd and 43rd streets, although only half of the project was realized (Figure 22). The complex includes St. Andrew's Chapel (Figure 23) in an updated version of the English perpendicular Gothic with an attached sequence of buildings including the classroom buildings and library of the seminary, designed by Zantzinger, Borie, and Medary. The chapel and related buildings are owned by the University of Pennsylvania but unoccupied. On the northeast portion of the site is the Parent Infant Center, and on the northwest is the prestigious University of Pennsylvania-sponsored public, Penn Alexander School.

In the twentieth century a new building type, the three and four story apartment house, appeared in scattered sites around the district, usually with an elevator serving a central lobby and corridors. These buildings were typically built where two or more large houses could be acquired and demolished and are usually concentrated near the trolley lines between Baltimore and Woodland avenues and along Chestnut and Walnut streets. Examples include the Calvert Hall apartment house by Charles Schaef (1920) in the Southeast Quadrant, which survives as a single wing after a 1970s fire (Figure 24). It occupies the former site of the H.C. Townsend mansion at the corner of 41st Street and Baltimore Avenue. Others such as the Tudor-detailed Elizabeth Court (1911) by Sauer and Hahn on the 4000 block of Baltimore Avenue occupies what were the rear gardens of the large houses that faced Pine Street to the north (Figure 25). These apartment houses introduced a new level of urban density but also a transient population that marked the shift away from the stable and well-to-do professional neighborhood of the late nineteenth century.

The early twentieth century shift toward a transient population was paralleled by the adaptation of many of the larger houses to apartments by absentee owners or new speculators. After World War II, when the region was declared an Urban Redevelopment Zone, major changes occurred to the north along Chestnut and Walnut Streets which in the 1970s were transformed into one-way automobile viaducts with severe consequences for the neighborhoods and for the small retail districts that had developed along those streets. Equally important changes occurred to the south where the trolleys were routed underground through a tunnel under the University of Pennsylvania campus, coming above ground at 40th and Baltimore Avenues. To accomplish that project a row of large houses between 38th and Baltimore Avenue were demolished for the trolley tunnel and the houses fronting Franklin Terrace (which paralleled Woodland Terrace) were demolished to create the present trolley plaza.

These large-scale activities that began after World War II marked the transformation of West Philadelphia into a University-centered neighborhood with many of its resident's university faculty, staff and students. This corresponded to the massive Cold War-era growth of the University which brought thousands of full-time graduate students into the region and further destabilized the neighborhood.¹² At the same time, the University of Pennsylvania began expanding to the west and large properties such as the Horace Trumbauer-designed beaux arts Marie Eisenlohr house at 4200 Pine Street were acquired by non-profit organizations, in this instance the American College of Physicians which added extensively to the rear.

In the 1960s, the University made a significant effort to encourage its faculty and staff to live in the neighborhood, going so far as to commission architects to rehabilitate some of the rowhouses as housing

for permanent residents. A dozen or more houses were rehabilitated by architect Ron Turner, who also designed the intertwined brick court of houses that comprise the University Mews at 45th and Spruce Streets. Other modern buildings with garages in their basement are woven into the 4000 block of Baltimore Avenue, while modern garden apartments were constructed on the north side of the 4100 block of Spruce Street. Most of these followed the lead of the University in turning their entrances away from the street.¹³

Despite these changes, the texture and scale of the different zones of the Spruce Hill Historic District are clearly in evidence. The historic housing types, churches, shopping centers and other elements of the evolving community are well represented and the community has sufficient integrity to warrant designation as a local historic district.

6. SIGNIFICANCE

Introduction

The proposed Spruce Hill District is itself inclusive of other smaller and historically significant districts already listed in the Philadelphia Register, such as the Drexel-Govett Historic District, the 420 Row Historic District (420-434 South 42nd Street), the 4208-30 Chester Avenue Historic District, the Chester-Regent Historic District, and the Satterlee Heights Historic District (see Figure 1). Taken together, these comprise a total of more than 250 properties on the Philadelphia Register of Historic places, inclusive of individual nominations. The majority of these sites (individual and district listings) are in the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant. As discussed in the Description, above, for administrative purposes the larger district has been divided east to west at 43rd Street, and north to south at Spruce Street, into four quadrants (see Figure 2). While this nomination describes the whole of the Spruce Hill Historic District, only the Southeast Quadrant is currently proposed for listing (see Figure 3).

The Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, with the boundary as described in Section 3 and containing the historic resources as described in Section 4 and the nomination Inventory, is a significant collection of resources worthy of listing in the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places. The Southeast Quadrant is part of a larger Spruce Hill Historic District, which is one of the nation's best preserved collections of architectural styles from the mid nineteenth to early twentieth centuries and an example of the evolution of one of the nation's first streetcar suburbs. The district meets Criteria for Designation, A, C, D, E and J for listing in the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places, as delineated in Section 14-1004 of the Philadelphia Code, the City's historic preservation ordinance.

This nomination argues that the proposed Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, is significant under Criterion A for its historical development as a community and for the wealth and high caliber of examples of mid-to-late nineteenth and early twentieth century architecture, including excellent examples of Italianate, Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Neo-Grec, Second Empire, and Georgian Revival styles, among others. The district also satisfies Criterion C as it, "reflects the environment in an era characterized by a distinctive architectural style" and Criterion D, as it, "embodies distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style," with many architectural styles from various eras are visible across the district, all contributing to create a cohesive "environment."

The proposed district also fulfills Criterion E, exhibiting, "the work of a designer, architect, landscape architect or designer, or engineer whose work has significantly influenced the historical, architectural, economic, social, or cultural development of the City, Commonwealth, or Nation." Buildings in the district include works by an impressive cast of talented designers responsible for its architectural character. Buildings were commissioned by some of the most important Philadelphia architects, many of whom are already recognized in the Philadelphia Register, and in the National Register of Historic Places. Among those documented in this nomination are Samuel Sloan, Theophilus P. Chandler, G.W. and W.D. Hewitt, John D. Jones, and Willis G. Hale.

Lastly, the Spruce Hill Historic District satisfies Criterion J, describing as it does, "the cultural, political, economic, social, or historical heritage of the community" as an exemplary representation of West Philadelphia's development as a streetcar suburb. The history of architecture and transportation that form the basis of the historical significance of the district were always closely linked. Rapid innovations in transportation during the period of significance, 1850-1930, helped ensure that the rural farmland on the west side of the Schuylkill River would be transformed into the urban residential development that stands today. The National Register-listed West Philadelphia Streetcar Suburb Historic District, a larger residential area that contains the boundaries of the Spruce Hill Historic District, speaks to the national importance of this community in the era of its early development, alongside and directly benefited by, contemporaneous developments in transportation.

In summary, the significance of the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, is related to the overarching themes of transportation and speculative development, which are both discussed in further detail below. However, as architectural historian Leah Kacanda has pointed out, the success of the boundary set by the 1997 National Register District for the West Philadelphia Streetcar Suburb, shows that, "both transportation and speculative development were forces in development of most of West Philadelphia...[and] many neighborhoods outside of center city functioned as early commuter suburbs [such as Germantown and Chestnut Hill] that were connected to the downtown by public transportation networks." What distinguishes Spruce Hill from the broader territory of West Philadelphia and its counterpart commuter suburbs in other parts of the city is that the district, "is characteristic of an early commuter suburb that was absorbed by the urban environment." Additionally, its unique significance is reflective of its architectural value as one of the best collections of residential Victorian-era architecture in the nation. So, although development patterns in the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant, reflect the influence of the streetcar relative to the broader area, it remains distinctive in its architectural integrity. Elements of the streetscape that contribute to the significance of the district include red brick sidewalks and street trees which complement the low stone walls and iron fences that enclose small yards in front of a preponderance of buildings from all periods.

Historical Development of West Philadelphia

West Philadelphia changed dramatically from the eighteenth to the twentieth century. What was once an agrarian landscape across the Schuylkill River from William Penn's Philadelphia became an enclave for wealthy families to build their fashionable country estates in rural isolation. The region began as Blockley Township, was absorbed in the 19th century into the larger township of West Philadelphia, and finally incorporated into the City of Philadelphia in 1854. Early maps such as Scull and Heap's 1753, *A Map of Philadelphia and Parts Adjacent*, show farmsteads west of Mill Creek (near present day 43rd Street), with the eastern portion of the district still large estates (Figure 26). Mills are indicated in the vicinity of Woodland Avenue and Mill Creek. But by 1850, the rapid development and transformation of the region into a middle class streetcar suburb was underway.

Before European Settlement, West Philadelphia was inhabited by small settlements of the Lenape and Swedes. Recent archeological excavations show evidence of native settlements along the western bank of the Schuylkill River. William Warner (c. 1627-1707) is said to have purchased the land from the Native Americans in the late seventeenth century. Warner named his 588-acre estate Blockley, after his native parish in Worcestershire, England. His house, "Willow Grove," stood near present day Lancaster Avenue and 46th Street.¹

The community's first important growth spurt paralleled the publication of Andrew Jackson Downing's *Architecture of Country Houses* (1851) which popularized suburban living and led to the construction of dozens of early villa style suburban residences by such architects as Samuel Sloan and John Jones. A second phase of suburbanization and

speculative development in the 1870s and 1880s was made possible by the introduction of electric trolleys. This brought a splendid array of residential architecture in Victorian-era styles largely for the middle class, by architects such as the Hewitt Brothers and later Wilson Eyre, Jr. and R.G. Kennedy. Through the beginning of the twentieth century, Spruce Hill's population continued to grow as a residential district with the addition of apartment buildings to accommodate the growing community. The period of significance, 1850 to 1930, follows the evolution of Spruce Hill as a residential neighborhood, made possible by improvements to transportation to Center City provided by the streetcar. This period represents the height of construction driven by speculative development until the final period of significant construction ending in 1930.




Figure 27. A detail from the 1828 *Philadelphia & Environs* map of Philadelphia showing the bridge across Market Street, and Grays Ferry (red arrows). *Philadelphia & Environs*, (Philadelphia: H.S. Tanner, 1828), courtesy, Cartography Associates, David Rumsey Collection.

Essential to the development of Spruce Hill was the transportation infrastructure established by early settlers. Primary among these were the Schuylkill River crossings connecting the west bank to the growing city center. The first ferry service, at Market Street, was authorized by William Penn in 1682 and operated by Samuel England.² Unlike Powelton Village to the north, which was bracketed by the Market Street ferry to the south, and the Sculls Ferry (later the Spring Garden Street Bridge) to the north, Spruce Hill was bounded on the north by Market Street, but on the south and east by the Schuylkill River, with the closest crossing further south at the Lower Ferry, later Grays Ferry (Figure 27).³

The region remained largely farmland throughout the 18th century until the once separate and isolated area was connected to the city via the High (now Market) Street Bridge, or "The Permanent Bridge," in 1805, which replaced boat and ferry service. The bridge and improvements to the local highways stimulated industrial and population growth, "prompting a network of industries,

including stockyards, lumber mills, slaughterhouses, coal yards, foundries, and glass factories to serve the city across the river." Investment in infrastructure that supported movement westward on land. At the end of the 18th century highways provided connections west via Lancaster Pike and south via Darby Road.

The Market Street Bridge was later followed by the construction of the Chestnut, Walnut, and South Street bridges "that served the increasing traffic created first by omnibuses and after 1854 by the new technology of the rail-born horse-drawn streetcars." (Figure 28) As ease of access increased, so did the population.

In fact, from 1805 to 1810 the population on the west side of the Schuylkill River doubled, an indication of the connection between accessibility and the growing attraction to the land across the river. At this time a small Black community settled around 41st and Ludlow streets at the northeast district border. They worshiped at Monumental Baptist Church and buried their dead in the Rose Burial ground adjacent to the church (see Figure 20).

The second largest landholder was the family of Andrew Hamilton, which acquired 300 acres in what became known as Blockley Township, in 1735.6 The Hamilton estate, which would encompass 600 acres by 1789, extended through much of the area west of 38th Street to Mill Creek (now covered by 43rd Street and Clark Park). Andrew Hamilton's grandson, William Hamilton, inherited a 356-acre tract which had at its core what we know today as The Woodlands. The young Hamilton was an "eminent botanist and plant collector [who] made the property a New World model of contemporary English gardening techniques." He was also responsible for creating the neoclassical Woodlands mansion house (1770, 1786-1789) which stood then, as now, "as one of the greatest American domestic achievements of the eighteenth-century."8 The estate is the oldest architectural landmark in the neighborhood. Although it lies just outside the southern boundary of the district, as a target of the early regional road system, it warrants inclusion in any description of the area. Located near the Darby Road for convenience and access to the city, it gave its name to "Woodland Avenue" for the portion of that road within Philadelphia County. The estate's later role, after 1841, as the city's second garden cemetery (after Laurel Hill) attracted omnibus lines to carry its many visitors, while also making its near neighborhood attractive for early suburban development. It is fair to say that until the arrival of the University of Pennsylvania in 1872, the Woodlands in its various incarnations, as estate and later as garden cemetery, was the principal focus of the region.




Figure 29. A map showing the proposed street layout of the Hamiltonville development. Charles Ellet, Jr., A Map of the County of Philadelphia from Actual Survey Made Under the Direction of Charles Ellet, Jr., Civil Engineer, and in Accordance with the Act of Assembly passed June 30th, 1839, https://westphillyhistory.archives.upenn.edu/maps/1843-map-ellet.

One of the earliest development projects in the area was led by William Hamilton in the years 1804-1808. Recognizing the potential growth that access over the Market Street Bridge would provide, Hamilton divided up a portion of his land holdings into large house lots along a new network of streets. His intention was a small residential village with its own church and school called Hamilton Ville, Hamilton Village, or the Town of Hamilton (Figure 29). Actual development proceeded slowly, impeded by Hamilton's death in 1813 and the entanglements of his estate. Although the original structures of Hamilton Ville were lost to later development, Hamilton's plan established some of the spatial arrangements and street placement that would determine the later organization of the area during subsequent stages of suburbanization.




Figure 30. A plan for the Town of Hamilton, 1808. The lots colored in red had already been sold. Those, "without colour [sic] are now offered for sale." William Strickland, agent for William Hamilton, Esq., *Plan of the Town of Hamilton*, recorded 10 September 1808 and entered at the office of Robert Brook. Courtesy, Philadelphia City Archives and West Philadelphia Community History Center, https://westphillyhistory.archives.upenn.edu/maps/1808-plan-hamilton.

The streets followed the general pattern of the city grid but were given names of family members including James (now Chestnut) Street, Andrew (now Walnut) Street, William (now 39th) Street, Till (now 40th) Street and so on. The street system laid out by the Hamilton Estate had larger east-west streets alternating with parallel secondary alleys that offered the possibility of rear access, forming a hierarchy of larger and smaller building sites. These streets were interrupted every 500 feet by north-south streets that are typically medium width streets. Lined with concrete sidewalks from the early twentieth century, and frequently bordered by street trees, these give the region its suburban character (Figure 30). The Hamilton vison also incorporated open spaces as part of the plan for this new suburb. These have not survived; at present the principal open space of the community is found west of 42nd Street in the three squares of Clark Park, established in the early twentieth century when the land was donated by Clarence Clark, the region's principal real estate owner. These blocks had remained undeveloped until the end of the 19th century because they formed the water course of Mill Creek, which once passed north to south roughly along the line of 43rd Street before emptying in the Schuylkill.




Figure 31. The village of Maryland Ville is identified at the bottom left corner of the map, bridging Mill Creek. The Blockley Alms House is the shaded rectangle to the right (east) of the Woodlands Cemetery. S.M. Rea and J. Miller, *Map of Blockley Township including all public places, property owners, etc.* 1849.

West of the Hamilton holdings was a small mill village which developed along Mill Creek which, as its name suggests, was used to power mills during the early history of the region. The village was given the name of Maylandsville (Figure 31). Apart from some of the small houses along Woodland Avenue, the principal remaining feature that relates to this stage of history are the depressions that now are incorporated into Clark Park. These mark the locations of the mill ponds of the creek. The 1872 Hopkins *Atlas of West Philadelphia* shows another mill around Market Street while there was also a pond upstream on the Clarence Clark property that is now the west side of the Seminary property along 43rd Street. By 1872 most of Mill Creek had already been culverted and houses were being constructed along - and one suspects over - its former route.¹²

The Blockley name was also used to identify an Almshouse that was erected on the west bank of the Schuylkill, on 150 acres of land from the Hamilton estate. This enabled the city to move the Almshouse from its original location at 9th and Spruce Streets to this much less populated area west of the city. The first building was designed by William Strickland in 1830-34 and was at the center of a property that at its

height occupied a site of 187 acres (Figure 31).¹³ At the end of the 19th century, the site still consisted of 130 acres, making it the largest tract of land dedicated to a single purpose in the region; its campus was occupied by 4,000 inmates.¹⁴

Land along the eastern edge of the Almshouse tract was acquired by the University of Pennsylvania in 1870, a move that would also contribute to the transformation of the district. In addition to the many staff members who worked at Blockley Almshouse, and later physicians who worked at its subsequent incarnation as Philadelphia General Hospital, university faculty students and staff made their homes in the Spruce Hill neighborhood.

Central to the growth of the district were the two highways that framed it, the Darby Road (Woodland Avenue) on the south, and the extension of High Street (now Market Street) on the north. ¹⁵ The Darby Road originally linked to the Market Street Ferry and later to the Permanent Bridge at the same site, and then extended diagonally south and west toward a bridge over Cobb's Creek from which it proceeded southwest toward the crossings of the Susquehanna River to Baltimore. Opened in the early 18th century, it provided a principal means

of access to the Woodlands. Ferries and then bridges became the focus of development following traffic created first by omnibuses and then by the new technology of the rail-born horse-drawn streetcars in 1858 (see Figure 28). ¹⁶ By 1851, the West Philadelphia borough had become a separately governed district of the county with its own regional government center and a population that had surpassed 10,000. West

Philadelphia shared a consolidated police force with the city, and in 1854 was incorporated into the city when it expanded to include the entire county.¹⁷

The 1850 widening of the Permanent Bridge to accommodate rail lines made it possible for horsecar routes to be extended along Market and Chestnut Streets (Figure 32). The Philadelphia City Horse Car Line ended at a car barn at 42nd and Chestnut Streets (see Figure 13), while the Market Street line terminated at 41st Street and Haverford Avenue, north of Market Street. In addition, several railroad lines converged to the south of the Woodlands estate with a station at 48th Street. These routes were soon

joined in 1858 by additional trolley lines along Woodland Avenue and Walnut Streets that crossed the 1857 Chestnut Street Bridge and gave ready access to most of the district as far west as 46th Street. These later lines are the basis for the present trolley network that fans out from a tunnel at 40th Street and Baltimore Avenue and 36th and Ludlow Streets (Figure 33).

Transportation access gave the area a brush with history. Rail access from the southern battlegrounds as well as boat access from the Schuylkill caused the U.S. military to construct the 4500 bed Satterlee Hospital, one of the largest major military hospitals, on the hill above 44th Street and Baltimore Avenue (Figure 34). It followed the pattern of temporary construction with tents to reduce the potential of infection. After the war, the hospital was demolished and the site developed with large stone, porchfronted, twin houses with mansard roofs, but the property continued to be called "Satterlee Heights" on the Hopkins Atlas into the 1870s (Figure 35). A stone from the Gettysburg Battlefield in Clark Park commemorates the hospital.

Because of its role as an early suburb, the Spruce Hill Historic District contains a rich variety of buildings by many of the principal architects of the city. The first phase of the regional development as an early mill village adjacent to the great Woodlands estate is now almost entirely erased, except for the street grid.²⁰ The first suburban phase began with the subdivision of portions of the Hamilton family holdings east of 40th Street and continued with the extension of the suburb west toward the terminus of the horsecar lines. Philadelphia has a number of these suburbs including the Tulpehocken Street neighborhood of Germantown, but this area contains a greater number of such houses including blocks of picturesquely

composed, porch-fronted houses with small front and side lawns. Samuel Sloan and John D. Jones introduced a more elaborate, balanced composition of units of different forms arranged symmetrically that is unusual for Philadelphia real estate development. Several blocks including Woodland Terrace for developer Charles Leslie (Figure 36), the west end of the 4000 block of Pine Street for John Mitchell (Figure 37), and the 200 block of South 42nd Street between Locust and Spruce Streets (Figure 38) are sufficiently intact to see the balanced composition while other blocks, including Sloan's Hamilton Terrace on 41st Street, can only be understood from published period prints.²¹

In addition, there are numerous individual houses by important mid-century architects including the towered Italianate house for William Lofland at 41st and Pine Street, and the broad porch-fronted Italianate mansion of William Barker at 4207 Walnut Street (now occupied by Walnut Hill College), both by Samuel Sloan in the 1850s. Sloan and Sloan & Stewart, also appear to have been the designer(s) of





4000, 4002 and 4004-4006 Pine Streets (see Figure 12) as well as 4039-4041 Baltimore Avenue.²² All of these are good examples of the type of work that Sloan disseminated nationally through his pattern books of the 1850s, which continued the lines of thought proposed by Andrew Jackson Downing in *The Architecture of Country Houses* (1851).²³ Both authors advocated suburban residences as a means to strengthen the family unit and as celebrations of American individuality.

Another characteristic house type of the region was the large suburban mansion owned by wealthy families who were likely to hire important architects associated with commissions for elite institutions and owners. For a moment around the Civil War the resulting

community appeared likely to become the most fashionable in the city with a cluster of immense mansions along Locust, Spruce and Walnut Streets west of 38th Street including the compound containing the homes of banker and financier Anthony J. Drexel and his children (on the Penn campus at 39th and Locust Streets) and to the west the immense house of banker Clarence Clark on an entire city block between 42nd and 43rd Streets and between Locust and Spruce Streets, and another equally palatial mansion for distiller Joseph Sinnott who was a partner with Henry Gibson in John Gibson & Sons Liquors. Further to the west were other immense properties that might have been occupied by similarly sized mansions, but instead were being filled with more modest houses. All of these have been demolished leaving only Sloan's Barker

house at 4207 Walnut Street, now used as the Restaurant School, as evidence of the pre-Civil War mansion type that once made this portion of West Philadelphia a fashionable suburb.

After the Civil War, as the neighborhood grew more urban and denser, elite architects such as Frank Furness and George Hewitt became the principal designers of the region and marked its still-elevated social status. Their works are denoted by the shift to Victorian hard pressed brick with corbelled cornices and decorative brickwork often accented by stones of various colors. The most important examples are on the site of the Sinnott house and attributed to the Hewitts, between 42nd Street and St. Marks Square and Walnut and Locust Streets (Figure 39). A double row of houses were designed by Frank Furness at the west end of the 4000 blocks of Locust Street and Irving Street.²⁴ Another important group are the large Victorian twins joined by screen walls and recalling R. Norman Shaw's Queen Anne work at Bedford Park London, also by the Hewitt Brothers at 42nd and Baltimore Avenue (Figure 40) as well as the formerly porch-fronted row between Pine and Spruce Streets along 42nd Street and the remarkable porch fronted row on the 4200 block of Spruce Street. The Hewitt projects were part of the development of the region by builder William Kimball who was an in-law of the Clark family and served their building interests.²⁵

When Lippincott Press published *Philadelphia and its Environs: A Guide to the City and Surroundings* in 1889, it described the now mature suburb as a highlight of the city:

This section of West-Philadelphia...is in the older part, a charming region of well-built homes, of densely shaded and well-paved streets, and of handsome and luxurious churches and useful public institutions.²⁶

The interrelationship between building and finance is an important part of the changing nature of building in the city

of homes; heretofore builders had often been capitalized by landowners who put up the land and often much of the capital in exchange for the development of the property. Ground rents were ended by law in Philadelphia in the middle of the 19th century when the city merged with the county.²⁷ As such, late 19th century construction depended on access to investment capital. In the instance of the Clark family²⁸

who owned land, had access to capital, and were able to provide these essential commodities to their chosen builder, they could continue to commission elite architects whose work enhanced the community where they lived while ensuring a steady return on their capital. Using their in-law, William Kimball, who became an important builder across West Philadelphia, the Clarks were responsible for many of the blocks of houses from Regent Street below Baltimore north to Spruce Street and their estate.

Other blocks, including 3900 Pine and Baltimore Avenue, the houses on St. Marks Square between 42nd and 43rd Streets, the twin houses with terra cotta detail on the 4300 block of Walnut, and the Victorian houses on the 4400 blocks of Chestnut and Sansom Streets can also be linked to the Hewitts and show architectural conviction in their design. By contrast, modest brick with stone trim rows such as those on the west side of 42nd Street below Pine Street and the 4200 blocks of Pine Street and Osage Avenue show builders adapting the work of elite architects



into the simpler forms of the rowhouse (Figure 41, see Figure 18). Many of these houses once had front porches as badges of their suburban setting following the model of the St. Marks Square houses. In the twentieth century, with the arrival of a different cultural taste, the gradual failure of wood elements, and the shift of social activity from the porch to the interior, porches have often been removed with the result that the facades look somewhat less adorned than originally intended.

At the end of the century, a third generation of distinguished architects including Wilson Eyre, Jr., R. G. Kennedy, and George T. Pearson, brought their talents to the area along with less well-known architects who built the rows and dense groups of twins that filled out the domestic neighborhood. In the case of Eyre, Kennedy, and Pearson, their work looked toward British sources, particularly the Queen Anne, as in the case of the block of small twins by Eyre at 4501-07 Spruce Street, or the Gothic Revival, as in the case of Pearson's Atkinson house on the 4100 block of Locust Street, and mark the final phase of the region as a center for elite housing. Commissions for churches follow a similar pattern with important architects such as Charles Burns, Addison Hutton, the Hewitts, and later Carrère and Hastings, designing churches for elite residents.²⁹

By the late nineteenth century there was a shift to lesser known architects for many of the developers of contemporary houses and small apartment buildings, for example William McCauley for the granite fronted houses at 40th and Pine Street, and Andrew Sauer and

Twentieth century West Philadelphia was given its first public open space when Clarence Clark donated the land occupied by the original Mill Creek ponds below Baltimore Avenue which had been described as a "gully used as a refuse dump."³⁰ Nine acres in extent, today it forms the principal public space between the Schuylkill River and Cobbs Creek Parkway. Among its remarkable features is a bronze sculpture by Frank Elwell of the 19th century novelist Charles Dickens. The sculpture shows Dickens seated, while at the base is a figure of one of his literary creations, Little Nell. The piece was acquired by the Fairmount Park Art Association and installed in 1900 and has the particular distinction of being the only known sculpture of the author who proclaimed that his works were his monument.³¹

If the nineteenth century was a period of growth for the Spruce Hill Historic District, the twentieth century was generally a period of stasis and decline, stimulated largely by changing fashion for elite residences and by the shift to a transient student population after World War II. This weakened important institutions such as churches (many of which have since closed), and caused the conversion of single family housing to multi-family units, many by absentee and speculative owners.

In the 1970s, significant changes occurred along the north side of the district with the alteration of Walnut and Chestnut Streets into one-way automobile arteries. This precipitated the decline of once stable residential districts and led to the clearing of large properties – helping to determine the northern limits to the district. Recent years have seen a resurgence of interest in West Philadelphia, and neighborhoods throughout the city, where the call has been for more housing and increased density. The changes brought by these pressures are most visible along Chestnut Street where buildings have been cleared for high rise apartments. Among the losses has been the demolition of Christ Memorial Reformed Episcopal Church at 43rd and Chestnut Street (just outside the district), replaced with a seven story apartment building containing 278 units. Another multi-story residential project is in progress across from Clark Park, at 43rd and Baltimore Avenue. While this is not a new use or form in the Spruce Hill Historic District, contributing apartment building properties typically contain up to 100 units, and were largely built with materials common to the district (brick, schist stone, limestone, terra cotta, etc.).

Despite these changes, the Spruce Hill Historic District retains its character as an extension of the Victorian city. Its remarkable array of buildings by important architects for significant clients are still largely extant and have a sufficient degree of integrity to convey their historic character to the general public. As an ensemble it represents Philadelphia's contribution to the nation's architectural heritage and makes this community worthy of listing in the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places.

Notes on the Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant

The Spruce Hill Historic District, Southeast Quadrant is distinguished by some of the earliest historic resources in the larger Spruce Hill Historic District. It also contains the highest concentration of properties already recognized by listing in the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places, a total of 197 properties counting districts and individually designated sites. (The Northeast Quadrant has the next highest number of properties listed in the Philadelphia Register, at 45.) Perhaps the most notable listed district in this quadrant is Woodland Terrace, a block of substantial brownstone Italianate twins designed by Samuel Sloan for developer Charles Leslie c. 1861, across from The Woodlands. This full block of speculative twin houses established a new pattern of development, and marked the shift away from single houses built for individual owner occupants which had been the norm up to this time. The influence of Sloan's design of this gracious "suburban villa" type, can be seen elsewhere in Spruce Hill, and elsewhere in greater West Philadelphia.³²

Sloan also designed suburban villa twins for Edwin Rafsnyder on the 4000 block of Pine Street a few years later, c. 1864.³³ Nearby, the Drexel-Govett Historic District, roughly bounded by Baltimore Avenue (south), Delancey Street (north), and 39th and 40th streets, records two speculative developments which included Sloan-inspired twins but also brick rowhouses, with a period of significance from 1865 to 1883. Other early houses by Sloan can be found on the 4000 block of Pine Street. As residential construction increased in the last quarter of the 19th century, two churches were built in the Southeast Quadrant, Trinity Episcopal Church, designed by Charles Burns and built in 1879 at 42nd and Baltimore Avenue, and Woodland Presbyterian Church, designed by Isaac Purcell & P. Taylor c. 1871 at 42nd and Spruce.

The Blockley Alms House, adjacent to the Woodlands, and the University of Pennsylvania, which established itself as a West Philadelphia institution beginning in 1872, would influence residential development throughout the district. The proximity of the Southeast Quadrant to the University (and likewise the Northeast Quadrant) would see the university playing an outsize role in the development of the apartment building as a housing type in this Southeast Quadrant. The focus on multi-tenant housing, namely apartment buildings, would proliferate in Spruce Hill, particularly in the eastern quadrants. There are 14 low rise apartment buildings built between 1900 and 1925 in the Southeast Quadrant, and 4 mid-rise apartment buildings in the quadrant built in the same period. The neighborhood is seeing a revival of this trend, but with much denser apartment block developments.
