





RCO QUALIFICATIONS

- An adopted statement of purpose
- Boundaries, included in your Bylaws
- Regular meetings that are publicly-announced,
 and open to the public (4 in 2024)
- Leadership, chosen by members, through elections, regularly (must follow that schedule)





RCO RIGHTS

- The right to be notified
- The right to participate in a public meeting
- The assurance that the ZBA/CDR will not issue a decision on a case until 1) a meeting has been held, or 2) the 45 days have expired
- Affected RCOs have a right to be consulted when scheduling the public meeting and to participate in that meeting.
- Any RCO or member of the public has a right to send a letter or give testimony at a ZBA hearing or CDR



RCO RESPONSIBILITIES

- Make a good faith effort to work with the applicant to hold a public meeting
- Ensure that all affected RCOs, and the public, can
 access and participate in the meeting.
- Coordinating RCOs have the responsibility for ensuring that a written summary of the meeting is sent to ZBA* (RCOZBA@phila.gov), pcpc.zoning@phila.gov, the applicant, City Council, and other RCOs.



RCO RESPONSIBILITIES (continued)

- If no meeting was held, Coordinating RCOs have the responsibility to send an explanation as to why not
- All RCOs have the responsibility for fulfilling all RCO-related functions regardless of an applicant's willingness to provide payments/donations to the RCO
- Coordinating RCOs have the responsibility to impartially document what occurred during* the public meeting



Community Benefits Agreements (CBAs)

1-- RCOs must make publicly available the terms of any benefits agreement they enter into with an applicant

2-- The terms of these agreements, if known, should be included in public advertisement of the meeting, and shared in the meeting



Community Benefits Agreements (CBAs)

3--- RCOs are required to make an annual reporting (in January) of any CBAs they entered into the previous year

If an RCO is asking for a direct contribution, it must be in a written agreement, and it must be reported.

RCO Boundaries and Boundary changes

In January 2023, the Planning Commission approved:

- Beginning in June 2023,
 RCO boundaries must follow physical features (streets, water, rail)
- Restricting requests for boundary changes to once per year during the annual registration.



ANNUAL REGISTRATION

- Most RCOs must submit current bylaws, a meeting announcement, and a proposed meeting schedule
- You can check your <u>Expiration</u> Year on the RCO List

ANNUAL REGISTRATION

2024 changes

- Meeting schedule, leadership list, elections schedule directly on the application form
- We ask how you advertise your meetings and provide an example meeting announcement
 - Flyer should show RCO name, and all info needed to access meeting





- Appeals Calendar (upcoming appeals, past results)
- CDR Site (agendas, plans)
- RCO Notifications Site (everything notice related, code and regs)
- Atlas (permit, ownership, appeals, deeds)
- Openmaps (RCO boundaries)
- RCO Site (video of this session, zoom meeting tips, registration link)
- RCO Videos (https://bit.ly/dpdvideos 10-minute videos on RCOs and the RCO process)





- Effective Mid-July, the Exhibit Submission Tool is the Zoning Board of Adjustment's new form of exhibit and document submission.
- Who can utilize the submission tool? Applicants, Registered Community Organizations, City Council, General Public
- All stakeholders can upload their exhibits, documents, and correspondence regarding an open ZBA case

RCO MEETING SURVEY

- Survey sent out in January 2024, over 100 RCOs responded
- Focusing on zoning meetings...
 - 41% of RCOs are hosting virtual meetings,
 36% in-person, and 24% are holding hybrid
 - 14% of RCOs report alternating format depending on the meeting. 28% alternate locations



RCO MEETING SURVEY

- Some RCOs (13%) still have health concerns with in-person, 27% are concerned with accessibility
- For virtual 26% were concerned with internet access, 22% with managing chat/interactions, 10% with voting issues
- Voting methods varied, 29% doing verbal/hand voting online, 27% electronic
