Title 4- The Technical Codes

 As you saw, there are many Technical Codes covering specific rules, regulations, and requirements around construction, maintenance, fire safety, and more

Like their name suggests, they tend to be dense, hyper-specific, and...technical.

• You don't *need* to be a subject matter expert to use or interpret them, but they can be intimidating and challenging if you are new to the subject at hand.

Title 4- The Administrative Code


- The Administrative Code controls how L&I administers the Technical Codes
- Chapters:
 - 1. General
 - 2. Enforcement Authority
 - 3. Permits
 - 4. Inspections
 - 5. Violations
 - 6. Penalties
 - 7. Certificates and Approvals
 - 8. Appeals and Variances
 - 9. Fees

Admin Code- Highlights

A-601- Fines - Violation fines break down to three categories: basic fines, Class II fines, and Class III fines

- Basic- \$300 per day
 - All violations not specified as Class II or Class III
- Class II- \$1,000 per day
 - Uncertified/expired cert for fire alarm or sprinkler, Fire Code egress violations, violations of historic district standards
- Class III- \$2,000 per day
 - Unsafe or ID designation, unsafe conditions (via violation of Fire Code), zoning or use registration violations
- A-601.5 Accrual of fines: Each day that a violation continues after the time for correcting the violation as stated in the initial notice of violation has passed, and where no timely appeal has been filed...shall be deemed a separate offense for purposes of determining the accrual of fines.

Audits and Investigations



- Maintenance Certification- The third-party certification of a structure or system that must be provided to the Department on a recurring schedule. There are two categories of Maintenance Certifications:
 - Property Maintenance Certifications-
 - Facade, Fire Escape, Private Bridge, Pier- Must be submitted every 5 years
 - Fire Protection Certifications
 - Sprinkler, Standpipe, Special Hazard, Fire Alarm, Smoke Control- Must be submitted annually
 - **Damper-** Must be submitted every 4 years (6 years for hospitals)

Title 9- Regulation of Businesses, Trades and Professions

9-1000- Trades

• **Contractor Compliance**- Primarily operates out of and enforces **9-1000**- **Trades**, which regulates contractors and other trade licensees like plumbers, electrical contractors, demolition contractors, etc.

• 9-1300- Inspection Businesses

 We also work with 9-1300- Inspection Businesses, particularly for Special Inspection Agencies and Electrical Inspection Agencies

9-1004- Contracting Requirements

9-1004(7) establishes prohibited conduct by contractors. Here are some highlights:

- (7) Prohibited Conduct
 - (b) No Contractor shall deviate from or disregard in any material respect the plans and specifications approved by the Department, unless such change has been approved by the Department.
 - (d) No Contractor shall sell, transfer, or otherwise allow another person or business entity to use a permit issued to the Contractor to perform construction work.
 - (e) No Contractor shall provide false information on any license or permit application filed with the Department.
 - (f) No Contractor shall employ an unlicensed subcontractor to perform any activity regulated under this Section.
 - (h) No Contractor shall employ an individual that is subject to an active suspension or revocation of a trade license or that was the partial or whole owner of an entity subject to an active suspension or revocation of a trade license at the time that the suspension or revocation was effectuated.

Contractor Compliance- Priorities

- -Increased focus on subcontracting practices
- -Verification of worker safety training and trade specific license/registration (Plumbing, Fire Suppression, Excavation, etc.)
- -Investigation and discipline of contractors who engage in unsafe work or who exhibit a pattern of repeated or willful violations

Unannounced Jobsite Inspections

- AIU inspectors perform unannounced jobsite inspections. These inspections include:
 - Ensuring that an OSHA 30 card holder is on site (when work is happening on a major building) and that every single worker on site has an OSHA 10 card (and is employed by a licensed contractor)
 - Requesting a list of subcontractors involved in the project to verify that only licensed subcontractors are involved.
 - Checking to make sure that all required insurance is up-to-date
 - More, depending on jobsite and nature of complaint

- Increase in auditing- don't be surprised if you get an email from an L&I official asking for a list naming each subcontractor on your project
- Inspections verifying subcontractor information
- Subcontractors are required to be listed on all permits except for 1 and 2 family dwellings

All Commercial Building Permits require any subcontractors to be listed on the permit by the permit holder.

§ 9-1004. Contractors

- (8) Contractor and Subcontractor Information.
- (a) A Prime Contractor performing construction work, except for work on residential buildings of two dwelling units or less, shall submit the following information in writing, either electronically or otherwise as required, to the Department within three (3) business days after the commencement of any work at the construction site and shall notify the Department promptly of any changes to the information submitted.
- (.3) A list of all subcontractors of any tier used on the project with their respective contractor license numbers;

Clarification and Intent

- If a subcontractor is working or has worked on site, they must be listed as a subcontractor on the permit
- The Department is not requiring a full list of intended subcontractors after
 3 days of commencement of work
- This information is required to be maintained and updated throughout the duration of the project.

Repeated Failure to List Subcontractors

§ 9-1004. Contractors (9) License Suspension and Revocation; Other Remedies (b) Where there has been a final determination that a contractor or subcontractor has violated the provisions of subsection (8)(a) of this Section on at least two (2) occasions within one (1) year, the license issued to the contractor or subcontractor under this Section shall be revoked for a period of one (1) year and the contractor or subcontractor shall be prohibited from obtaining any building permits during that one (1) year period. For purposes of this subsection (9)(b), a final determination refers to payment of the fine for a violation, a default or a final adjudication on the merits from which no timely direct appeal is available.

Contractor Lookup Website



Add a subcontractor to a permit in eCLIPSE
How-To Guide

- **Step 1**: On the *Home page* of your account, click on the 'My Activities' tab.
- **Step 2:** Under the 'Permits' section, click on the applicable Building permit.




- **Step 3**: On the *permit details* page click the 'Subcontractors' tab.
- **Step 4**: Click on the 'Select Subcontractors' tab. **Note:** Click on the blue dot for helpful information.



Step 5: In the pop-up window, enter the 'Legal Name' or 'License Number' in the appropriate boxes.

Note: If you cannot find the subcontractor you are looking for by searching their legal name, either reach out to them and get their license number or try searching for the owner of the company.

Step 6: Click the 'Search' button.




Step 7: Check the box next to the applicable subcontractor and click on 'Select'.

Note: The selected subcontractor will appear on the permit details page.

Note: Repeat the steps to add additional subcontractors on this permit.

Note: To remove a subcontractor, click on the red 'X' button.

Step 8: Once all subcontractors are listed, click on the 'Save' button.



Worker Safety Training

A-1001.4 Worker training requirements: 276

- 1. In order to protect public safety, all workers performing duties at a construction or demolition site, regardless of their position, shall have completed a course of OSHA 10 training, and carry the card at all times.
- 2. All independent contractors working at a demolition site shall be licensed in accordance with <u>Chapter 9-1000</u> of The Philadelphia Code.
- 3. The worker training requirements of this Section shall apply only to persons performing construction or demolition activities for which a permit must be obtained, and do not apply to delivery persons, design professionals and their staff, special inspectors and similar persons performing duties at a construction or demolition site whose work is not considered construction or demolition work regulated by a permit.
- 4. A licensed contractor who employs any such worker shall maintain a copy of such written proof for each worker under his/her employ on file and make it available to the Department upon request.

A-1001.5 Site Safety Manager: ²⁷⁷A Site Safety Manager with OSHA 30 training must be designated by the general contractor and present during the construction or demolition of a Major Building.

License Investigations

Insurance

§ 9-1004. Contractors. (5) Insurance Requirements.

- (a) All Contractors licensed under this Section shall maintain, at a minimum, the following types and amounts of insurance:
- (.1) workers' compensation where applicable: statutory limits;
- (.2) comprehensive general liability insurance: in an amount determined by the Law Department and the Risk Manager;
- (.3) products and completed operations, and/or errors and omissions: in an amount determined by the Law Department and the Risk Manager; and
- (.4) motor vehicle liability insurance: in an amount determined by the Risk Manager.
- (b) Copies of insurance certificates shall be submitted to the Department to show proof of insurance coverage before a license will be issued.
- (c) Failure to maintain proper insurance, and to provide proof of continued coverage by submitting renewal certificates to the Department, will result in the revocation or non-renewal of the license.

License Investigations

Cooperation and Response to Inquiries

§ 9-1004. Contractors

- (6) Required Conduct.
- (i) Contractors shall cooperate in any audit or investigation by the Department, or other city or law enforcement agency, into the activities at any job site at which the contractor has performed work, and shall provide prompt, accurate and complete responses to inquiries by the Department and other appropriate agencies

License Violations

- Every contractor violation observed by my unit results in a License of Notice Violation and a fine of at least \$1,000 per violation.
- Those violations can be appealed to the Board of L&I Review.
- Violations result in a bill and, eventually, Municipal Court Enforcement
- Permit Hold The Department has the right to hold issuance of new permits to Contractors that have unpaid fees or fines

Licensing Violation Notices

- **License Violation Notice (LVN)-** The Notice issued when AIU determines that a contractor has violated the conditions of their license
 - Cites violations of Title 9, rather than Title 4 (like most other L&I violations)
 - Is issued to the responsible party's license, not to the property
 - Does not trigger reinspection
 - Does not "stay open" until an inspector has determined that it has been corrected, like a Title 4 violation.
 - Results in a fine even if the contractor corrects the behavior
 - Can be appealed to the Board of L&I Review, just like other violations
 - If no appeal is taken, we issue a bill for the fine amount 35 days later

In accordance with ¿¿, 9-105, each violation of ¿9-1000 or ¿9-1300 results in a fine of \$300, except for violations of ¿¿ 4 9-1004 (excluding subsection 8) and 22 9-1306, which each result in a fine of \$1,000, and violations of 22 9-1004(8), which each result in a fine of \$2,000. Repeated violations of Title 9 shall result in the suspension or revocation of the cited license, in addition to further fines.

If this Notice is not appealed, the fine will be imposed in 30 days and a bill will be issued. For the violations referenced above, the fine to be imposed is:

If you do not timely file an appeal then you waive your right to challenge any part of this notice. This includes whether the violations existed, whether you were responsible for the violations, and whether the City can impose any fines. fees, or costs against you, inclusive of the above indicated fines.

Repeated failure to meet the standards required under the Philadelphia Code may lead to a suspension or revocation of your license(s) under Philadelphia Code Sections 9-1004(9) and/or 19-2602.

Additionally, failure to timely appeal this notice will result in the immediate/automatic imposition of the fine thirty-one days after the date of this notice. Once imposed the fines may limit your ability to obtain or renew any permits and/or licenses pursuant to Philadelphia Code Section 9-101(9).

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License Suspension

- The Code authorizes suspension/revocation for a number of reasons set forth in 9-1004(9), including:
 - fraud or deceit in obtaining or renewing a license or permit;
 - repeated failure to comply with the provisions of The Philadelphia Code;
 - failure to pay any fine imposed for a violation of any provision of 9-1004
 - willful violation of a stop work order;
 - fraud or deceit in responding to a Department audit or investigation
 - violating the Philadelphia Code in a manner that creates a significant dangerous condition or significant risk to public safety
