



Appeals to the Board of License and Inspection Review Information Sheet

The Board of License and Inspection Review (BLIR) hears appeals of permits, violations, and notices issued by the Department of Licenses and Inspections and other City agencies. The Board affirms or alters property violation decisions issued by L&I or other City agencies. The board also hears appeals for licenses to carry and firearm license revocations.

Before you File the Appeal

- Before you file an appeal, you will need a copy of the notice or letter being appealed.
- All appeals to the Board of License and Inspection Review must be filed by the aggrieved party or property owner. If the appellant is a corporation or LLC, they are required to be represented by a lawyer.

How to File an Appeal

- · You can file an appeal in-person or by mail.
 - In-person: Make an <u>appointment to file an appeal</u> in-person at the Municipal Service Building. Bring the completed BLIR appeal application form and a copy of the notice or letter being appealed to your scheduled appointment.
 - By mail: Send a completed <u>BLIR appeal application form</u> and a copy of the notice or letter being appealed to the address:

- After receipt of a complete appeal application package, a hearing notice will be sent to you with your scheduled hearing date by the Boards Administration Unit.

When to File an Appeal

• You may file an appeal immediately after receiving a violation / notice / letter. However, your right to appeal expires thirty (30) days from the first notice of violation.

What is the Basis of an Appeal?

- An application for appeal shall be based on a claim that:
 - The appellant is aggrieved by the issuance, transfer, renewal, refusal, suspension, revocation or cancellation of any City license or by any notice, order or other action as a result of any City inspection, affecting the appellant directly.

Board of L&I Review Decision

A decision from the Board of L&I Review may affirm, modify, reverse, vacate or revoke the action from which the appeal
was taken.
