Our administration has invested in a comprehensive approach to lift residents out of poverty and to break the cycle for future generations. The work of the Serve Philadelphia VISTAs is an important part of moving the City's anti-poverty strategy forward.

What do Serve Philadelphia VISTAs do?

Each VISTA position is unique to the City department or initiative, but <u>all</u> VISTAs will build capacity. Capacity building activities can include, but are not limited to:

- Creating tools, systems and guides like databases, policy briefs and marketing materials
- Generating resources through partnerships, volunteers and/or grant-writing
- Developing, organizing and/or assessing programs, events and/or meetings
- Supporting, establishing, or strengthening cross-departmental and cross-sector partnerships

Requirements:

- 18 years or older, high school degree or equivalent GED

- Criminal background check (if accepted)

Economic Opportunity: Employment/Workforce Development

Project Goal:

The goal of the City College for Municipal Employment's (CCME) VISTA project is to support pathways into City Government jobs for special populations of high need in Philadelphia, including the adult education, reentry, and youth populations. The VISTA Member will help increase the capacity of CCME to add special population activities to its portfolio of programs by researching the populations, identifying any existing activities in this space in other cities, helping identify potential job roles for this population, and making recommendations as to proposed models.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Connect with the Mayor's Office of Adult Education and the Office of Reentry Partnerships (ORP) to learn more about the specific needs of this population and potential workforce program ideas.
- Connect with the Office of Human Resources staff to understand what City roles the potential populations are eligible for and what Departments have oversight for those roles.

- Research other City workforce pipeline models using the City as a model employer.

Healthy Futures: Access to Health Care

Project Goal:

The Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services is launching the START Model, a community-based crisis intervention for individuals with intellectual disabilities, autism, and mental health needs. With this needed support, people with intellectual disabilities, autism and mental health needs have improved mental health, fewer restrictive hospital-based stays, and can more consistently and successfully live and work in their communities. The Business Intelligence VISTA will work with the team to identify and integrate the programmatic and data informed processes that achieve and sustain these outcomes.

Infant and Toddler Homelessness Resource VISTA

Department of Behavioral Health and Intellectual disAbility Services, Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention

Education: K-12 success

Project Goal:

Extreme poverty is the strongest predictor of homelessness and at least 11% of children living in poverty are homeless. Unstable housing has a significant impact on early childhood development (Infants Exposed to Homelessness: Health, Health Care Use, And Health Spending from Birth to Age Six, 2019). Emergency and Transition Housing agencies have very limited resources to connect families to the Philadelphia Infant Toddler Early Intervention (ITEI). Direct, on-site support by ITEI yielded a significant increase in the number of referrals. The VISTA will work with the ITEI team to develop and evaluate effective procedures to promote referrals of families in Emergency and Transitional Housing and for families that are diverted from these housing options or are in other temporary housing options.

- Coordinate and attend on-site visits with a team member; speak directly with parents of infants and toddlers; answer their questions and support the referral to ITEI
- Review and analyze data

Project Goal:

The Department of Commerce aims to serve as a primary resource for Philadelphia business data and research. The Community Engagement & Neighborhood Data Collection VISTA will update the Department of Commerce's data set through in-person surveying of businesses on commercial corridors. The VISTA will analyze data results to recommend programs that would improve safety and generate wealth in communities.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Review and analyze program materials: Evaluate the previous year's work, identify key goals for implementation, and ensure alignment with objectives.
- Collaborate with team members: attend virtual or in-person meetings to discuss progress, challenges, and feedback related to ongoing projects.
- Develop and refine program resources: work on tools like the SIP Video, FAQ resource, or other materials to improve accessibility and usability for applicants (aka business owners).
- Organize and facilitate focus groups: coordinate sessions with past and prospective applicants to gather insights and incorporate their feedback into program improvements.
- Monitor and document progress: track the status of identified goals, document achievements and challenges, and prepare updates for the team.

Project Goal:

The goal of the Department of Commerce's Small Business Data & Engagement VISTA project is to collect and analyze data to make programmatic improvements to our small business resources. The InStore Forgivable Loan and the Business Training and Assistance Program serve low to moderate income small business owners located in high poverty areas of the city. The VISTA Member will help increase the capacity of the Department of Commerce by gathering and analyzing data from program participants and loan recipients. The VISTA Member will prepare recommendations based on the data to help improve the program outcomes to improve business operations and generate wealth in communities.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Update and analyze data to create program recommendations in the Instore Database.
- Interview business owners who were awarded Instore Forgivable Loan to learn about their experience with the program and its impact on their business.
- Attend meetings, site visits & grand openings for businesses who have been awarded through InStore.
- Monitor survey collection for Small Business Education program participants, assessing response rates and survey quality.
- Support meetings with Business Education providers, offering recommendations based on survey data around program improvements.
- Complete survey summary documents to provide a snapshot of small business satisfaction.

Project Goal:

The Strategic Engagement VISTA will build structural capacity for the Office of Worker Protections and will prioritize the Fair Workweek law, a labor law that protects fair scheduling and increases economic security for certain service retail and hospitality workers. Shortfalls in weekly work hours (under employment), low wages, wage and job protection, and lack of access to benefits fuel poverty. Sustainable outcomes include increased worker protection resources, strengthened partnerships, and increased presence of the office on public platforms.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Observe an interview with a complainant and an Office Investigator to gain insights into how workers advocate for themselves in the workplace
- Use city resources including research that informs operations in areas of data trends, data processing practices and public engagement strategies
- Identify different levels of interest in worker rights engagement from various target groups

Environmental Stewardship: Awareness & Stewardship

Project Goal:

The goal of FDR Park's Environmental Stewardship VISTA project is to engage African-American, Latinx, and Southeast Asian communities in park stewardship. The VISTA member will help increase the capacity of FDR Park to expand and diversify the stewardship community, by evaluating needs and barriers to access, recruiting volunteers, and establishing a volunteer training program in order to train volunteers in more advanced stewardship skills.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Set up a meeting with a group that has volunteered in the past to discuss their experience
- Gather and edit content for the monthly volunteer newsletter
- Research examples of volunteer training related to groups active in the park, such as the Master Watershed Stewards, Master Gardeners, Master Naturalists
- Develop a volunteer survey using Google Forms
- Develop a budget proposal for volunteer acknowledgement–t-shirts, "Thank You" mailers etc.

Project Goal:

The goal of FDR Park's K-12 Education VISTA Project is to increase access to nature-based education at FDR Park among the BIPOC, immigrant, and diaspora communities surrounding the park, in cooperation with local schools, recreation centers, and teen centers. The VISTA Member will help increase the capacity of FDR Park by developing curricula for Field Trips and other nature-based educational activities for K-12 students at FDR Park, building strong partnerships with local schools, recreation centers, teen centers, and recruiting high school volunteers for youth workforce development programs.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Brainstorm age-appropriate educational activities for a "Mushrooms around Philadelphia" parks class
- Review interview questionnaire to send to Philadelphia school programs about their environmental curriculums
- Develop an evaluation rubric for the Youth Education Manager to use when crafting curriculum materials
- Connect with recreation centers to learn their methods of inclusive educational outreach.

Project Goal:

The goal of FDR Park's Workforce Education VISTA project is to support the immigrant and diaspora vendor communities of FDR Park (both Southeast Asian and Latin American) in their ongoing efforts to develop and implement community-driven leadership, entrepreneurial growth, and supportive external partnerships. The VISTA Member will help increase capacity of FDR Park by developing community-specific grant life-cycle resources, researching community stakeholder groups, developing outreach strategies, and observing and documenting day-to-day operations to develop best practices. This project term provides continued capacity building within FDR's programs that support the market communities path toward a permanent home and formalization.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Support the Strategic Manager of Market Communities by taking notes on a moderated feedback session with vendors and the vendor board.
- Research and develop a strategy to meet a grant's reporting requirements with the Grants Manager.
- Oversee a market day to learn and understand the market cultures and challenges/successes.
- Write an outreach letter or email to a potential partner, grant, or commerce organization.
- Develop a meeting agenda and assist with taking notes and minutes.

Project Goal:

The VISTA will support a mission to transform miles of riverfront brownfields into trails and parks, free outdoor programs; "green" job skill training, and land restoration projects. The VISTA will support a volunteer and job skill trainee base by researching best volunteer management practices, program design, direct engagement, and direct support of community activities. Intended, sustainable outcomes include:

- A growing base of community volunteers
- Residents of nearby neighborhoods use their riverfront parks as a resource of livable, vibrant communities
- PowerCorps PHL job skill trainees receive hands-on experience in urban forestry

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Review event surveys, speak with volunteers at events, and analyze volunteer participation data from the previous season to evaluate the volunteer experience to inform changes and improvements.
- Creating communications templates for thanking and recruiting volunteers.
- Identify local leaders, resources, and partners and perform outreach to increase engagement. Focus is Holmesburg, Torresdale, and Wissinoming neighborhoods.
- Develop new volunteer activities that respond to participant needs (more plantings, litter clean up, etc.)
- Develop new experiences to activate the Volunteer Station at Pennypack on the Delaware and make recommendations about the space and volunteer engagement.

The goal of the Health Department's Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Prevention VISTA project is to build capacity, raise awareness, and strengthen access to resources in the citywide partnership program of We Walk PHL. The VISTA will help increase capacity of the We Walk PHL team by conducting outreach and research to ensure a sustainable recruitment plan that prioritizes people, mainly Black women, for the existing 29 Parks and Recreation locations throughout the city and potential expansion beyond that.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Conduct research among peer cities that have volunteer-led walking programs to identify recruitment and engagement strategies.
- Connect with existing walk leaders and participants to understand the program.
- Create social media campaigns to spotlight walk leaders and participants to increase visibility and support recruitment efforts.
- Identify community groups around the existing We Walk locations to build a platform for engagement and recruitment.
- Identify walking programming opportunities (such as Girl Trek and Walk around Philadelphia) for cross promotion, collaboration and communication.
- Analyze safe walk routes or We Walk PHL sites for improvements and local environmental awareness.
- Explore the history of exclusion in parks and outdoor settings through conversations and research.

Education: K-12 success

Project Goal:

The goal of the Free Library of Philadelphia Foundation's Read by 4th Family Engagement VISTA project is to identify what the key needs are to improve family engagement - an essential strategy for youth literacy, particularly for families in which English is a second language and those who fighting generational illiteracy. The VISTA member will help increase capacity for Read by 4th's family engagement strategies by developing a parent council, through which community members closest to the problem are directly engaged in campaign strategy and action, supporting the work of Reading Captains, who are our network of grassroots volunteers who support literacy in their community, and researching and implementing improvements to the family workshops to be more engaging and scalable.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Meet and collaborate with parent council members to inform how to better support their work
- Develop a plan on how to successfully and equitably translate our family workshop into Spanish
- Facilitate an early literacy workshop for partner organizations and document any feedback
- Create a survey that will be used to measure the effectiveness of the family workshops
- Strategize with Reading Captains on successful recruitment strategies to build up the volunteer corps

Project Goal:

The Managing Director's Office for Health and Human Services is developing three initiatives to expand access to health care. These programs will serve three low-income populations. The first will serve individuals on Medicaid by increasing their access to more services and support. The second will serve individuals with medical debt by reducing their payments towards their debt. The third will serve people who are incarcerated by providing access to behavioral health care. The VISTA will play a key role in implementing services in partnership with City stakeholders, launching initiatives and developing a sustainability plan.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Email with HHS cabinet members and staff to learn about HHS programs and revise materials that describe recent updates
- Gather and synthesize information on other programs funded by Medicaid 1115 waivers
- Read state-provided implementation materials and summarize the key information in a memo for Philadelphia stakeholders
- Check in with supervisor
- Attend Philadelphia Overdose Response Coalition committee meeting to learn updates and discuss opportunities for increased collaboration, better coordinated response, and mitigation of barriers

Project Goal:

The Managing Director's Office – Health and Human Services (MDO-HHS) has developed or supported implementation of two programs that prevent housing insecurity through policy. These programs serve low-income populations which may have experienced water insecurity or interaction with the criminal justice system. The VISTA will, in collaboration with the Department of Public Health, the Office of Community Empowerment and Opportunity, and the Office of Criminal Justice, play a key role in the continued implementation of services. The VISTA will also focus on development and documentation of a strong sustainability plan for each program.

On an Average Day, You'll:

- Attend meetings with key stakeholders, including folks who implement these programs and those who
 make policy decisions around the programs
- Gather and synthesize information (one example might be a literature review) on the topic that the project covers
- Engage in discussion with stakeholders to address issues that arise and plan for sustainable solution
- Document discussions, and use that to build sustainability plan
- Build out communications documents needed for the programs
- Check in with supervisor

The VISTA Member will help increase capacity of MCOA by developing and implementing a strategy to identify and accessibly share senior-focused resources, including the creation of a resource database, procedures for ensuring information in the database is correct, relevant and up to date, as well as crafting language and digital access plans.

Education: College access and success for low-income students

Project Goal:

The Career Pathways VISTA within the Mayor's Office of Education will collaborate with education leaders to build accessible career pathways for Philadelphia's residents. The VISTA project will build lasting infrastructure that will align the education and workforce systems resulting in more Philadelphians obtaining critical postsecondary credentials necessary to secure good paying jobs.

The Community Schools initiative coordinates partnerships and programs that promote wellness, stability, and learning opportunities in 20 Philadelphia schools. The Community Schools model operates at three levels: the system level, the school level, and the student and family level. The VISTA will work at the system level, using national standards to identify the strengths and areas of growth for our initiative, develop systems and support strategic planning for new priorities.

Project Goal:

The Office of Children and Families (OCF) developed a pandemic food security response that included over 100 food and meal sites serving students, adults, and seniors, plus a free food distribution map. COVID-19 continues to exacerbate food and financial inequities in historically disadvantaged communities. The VISTA will help build our food security initiatives into sustainable models that enhance OCF's services and citywide reach.

Research by Harvard Professor of Public Economics Raj Chetty, and others, has provided clear evidence that economic opportunity is spatially distributed, which means that residents from segregated, under resourced neighborhoods face significantly greater barriers to economic mobility. In Philadelphia, a child from Fairhill is projected to have an adult household income of \$19,000 (well below the federal poverty level for a household of 3) compared to \$52,000 for a child from Bustleton. The goal of the VISTA project is to identify and reduce barriers to economic mobility through collaboration, data analysis, and strategic interventions in targeted neighborhoods. The project also informs the longerterm strategic direction of the Neighborhood Initiatives unit.

The VISTA member will help increase capacity of the Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion by collecting and analyzing demographic data to understand the impact of city policies, programs, and services, and assessing whether they fairly address the needs of all communities, particularly those facing systemic barriers or economic challenges and collaborate with staff to develop targeted, evidence-based strategies to ensure that city initiatives effectively promote opportunity, reduce disparities, and improve the quality of life for all Philadelphians.

This issue impacts Black and brown newcomers the most because unlike some other newcomer groups they do not have the depth of established well-funded networks (financial institutions, professional organizations, community groups) in Philadelphia that can make up for the gap of services provided by traditional providers. The VISTA will collaborate with Office of Immigrant Affairs staff to establish and sustain a network that supports emerging immigrant communities in their integration into the city.

Project Goal:

The goal of the Office of Innovation and Technology (OIT)'s VISTA project is to empower low-income Philadelphia households by increasing access to home internet, digital devices, and digital skills classes. The VISTA Members will help increase the capacity of OIT by creating an on-site City Digital Navigator program. The Members will design the program, including the procedures, materials, and resources. They will also test different strategies to assess the effectiveness of the program. The program will focus on three key elements of digital equity: connectivity, devices, and skills. By addressing these three factors, the City Digital Navigator program will elevate those households who are most in need of digital services, predominantly low-income, Black, Hispanic, immigrant, and Senior households.

Project Goal:

The goal of the Office of the Victim Advocate's (OVA) Data and Outcomes VISTA project is to leverage data as a tool to illustrate disparities and develop solutions for individuals and neighborhoods experiencing violence and to assist populations experiencing violence to reduce trauma and stress. The VISTA member will help build capacity for the Office of the Victim Advocate to direct advocacy, funding and planning efforts by developing and implementing data tools that synthesize, analyze and visualize areas of success, areas of growth, and areas of for further impact.

Safe Routes Philly VISTA

These methods, such as a walking school bus program and a traffic safety curriculum, can increase attendance and academic performance, helping to reduce learning loss and improve academic readiness. At the end of the third year of the project, the 12 schools supported by the VISTA will be positioned to train and mentor schools in the program beyond close out of the project.
