Re: 7801 State Road -- Riverview Wellness Village, Proposed New Building

Dear Art Commissioners and Art Commission Staff,

This letter is written on behalf of the Managing Director's Office (MDO), and the Capital Program Office (CPO), of the City of Philadelphia, regarding the proposed new 5-story building at the existing Riverview Wellness Village complex. Please consider this as our formal request to be placed on the agenda of the March 12, 2025 Art Commission meeting for Final Approval consideration.

This project received Concept Approval at the February 12, 2025 Art Commission meeting. In that meeting, the Commission requested: updated lighting plans; for us to consider whether solar panels would be appropriate; and to consider the addition of community garden plots. In response, our updated materials to be submitted next week respond to these comments in the following ways:

- Updated site plan drawings to more clearly show proposed site lighting fixture locations
- Identified a location on the Riverview Wellness Village site that garden plots are planned for the complex
- Although solar panels were given due consideration; ultimately, we've instead elected to maintain green roof to the extent feasible on our roof, to aid with stormwater quality design

As a reiteration of this project's mission, the new building is intended to expand capacity by approximately 300 residential beds, along with additional clinical care support functions. The construction of this new building is intended to address a critical gap in Philadelphia's wellness ecosystem by addressing a shortage in recovery-focused housing. The site's setting along the Delaware River provides the campus with a unique and tranquil environment which is supportive of the type of care it offers, and this new building is designed to take advantage of these positive aspects to enhance the experience of its residents on their road to recovery.







Campus Plan Diagram

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

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












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Campus Plan Diagram



MATURE CANOPY



The site has mature mid-century canopy trees to remain which will be protected and preserved. The project will fill gaps in the canopy while establishing diverse habitats across the site.

WATER AS INSPIRATION



The site's proximity to the Delaware River and riparian ecological habitats inform the planting design and stormwater management strategies.




