Distribution drives with community partners for these issues I've gained an inside look into many systems set forth to assist. Such as but not limited to; the Foreclosure and Tax lien process, Register of Wills, Tax freezes, Donations, Registered Community Organization (where you meet with developers and potential businesses who want to move in your neighborhood to discuss determining factors), Block captain meetings, Police community meetings, mental and substance abuse seminars.
