# Citizens Police Oversight Commission

The mission of the Citizens Police Oversight Commission (CPOC) is to oversee and investigate the conduct, policies, and practices of the Philadelphia Police Department (PPD).

#### **CPOC** currently:

- Receives complaints of police misconduct
- Audits and monitors Internal Affairs investigations and police disciplinary processes
- Sits and votes on PBI panels at police discipline hearings
- Conducts oversight of police shootings
- Analyzes police data
- Develops policy recommendations and reports
- Engages in outreach and training

#### Why Civilian Oversight Is Necessary

- Protects human rights
- Promotes constitutional policing
- Increases public confidence and trust in the police
- Builds bridges between law enforcement and the public
- Supports effective policing
- Ensures greater accountability
- Enhances risk management

#### **UPDATE ON SEATING NEW COMMISSIONERS**

#### **Selection Process:**

The selection process is being led by a selection panel composed of three appointees from City Council and two appointees from the Mayor's Office. The selection panel is composed of civic and community leaders.

- Bilal Qayyum, President of the Father's Day Rally Committee (Council Appointment)
- Christina Vega, Community in School Coordinator and Domestic Violence Advocate (Council Appointment)
- Caroline Stack, Director of Legislative Affairs for Councilmember Curtis Jones Jr. (Council Appointment)

## **Executive Director's Report**

#### **UPDATE ON SEATING NEW COMMISSIONERS**

- Candidate update: The Selection Panel has chosen candidates for the commissioner positions!
- Public Town Hall on March 18<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm: At the town hall, residents of Philadelphia can meet the candidates, ask them questions and provide feedback. CPOC will assist in organizing and managing the event.
- City Council Committee of the Whole Hearing: Following the town hall, there will be a Committee of the Whole hearing in City Council, where Councilmember Jones and I will present the five new Commission candidates. At this hearing, Councilmember Jones will introduce resolutions for the formal nomination of each commissioner.
- Final Confirmation: The final confirmation of the new commissioners will take place the Thursday following the Committee of the Whole hearing.

#### Investigations Division: Police Shootings (February 2025)

There was one police shooting at a person and one shooting of a dog in the month of February 2025. CPOC tracks all police shootings, which includes every time a PPD officer(s) discharges their firearm at a person or an animal (excluding deer).

In 2025 so far, there have been two police shootings at people.

The website provides an overview of PPD's procedure, CPOC's role, and details about the police shootings at people.

#### Investigations Division: Police Shootings (February 2025)

**February 3, 2025**. Shortly after 1:00AM, a uniformed patrol officer assigned to the PPD Airport Unit encountered a 36-year-old white man on a southbound I-95 offramp to the Philadelphia International Airport. The man told the officer he had been stabbed. The officer requested an ambulance and back up.

While waiting for backup and medics, the officer and the man got into a physical altercation. The officer attempted to tase the man, but it was ineffective. A second uniformed officer arrived as backup. The second officer shot the man multiple times after another taser attempt failed. The man was pronounced deceased at the scene.

## Investigations Division: Monitoring (February 2025)

Examples of the types of cases currently being monitored:

- Complaints alleging violations of the Fourth Amendment (search and seizure).
- Complaints alleging lack of service.
- Complaints alleging physical abuse.
- Complaints alleging inconsistent court testimony.

The Outreach & Training Division is tasked with handling incoming complaints, providing constituent services to city residents who need resources and connection with other city services, facilitating community education and training staff, as well as engaging with the many diverse communities of our city. We create content and manage all social media pages for the agency, and we accept and respond to media inquiries.

We look forward to expanding our staff to make meaningful connections with underserved communities while advocating and promoting transparent and equitable policing.




